**DID YOU KNOW? Stableford Scoring** was introduced by Dr Frank Barney Gorton Stableford. It was first used informally at the Glamorganshire Golf Club in Wales in 1898, and then first used in competition at Wallesey Golf Club in England in 1932. In this scoring method, golfers earn points based on the number

of shots taken per hole, and unlike traditional scoring the goal is to have the highest score.

It was introduced to deter recreational golfers from giving up their round after having one or two 'bad' holes with gross scoring. Plus, it has the added benefit of speeding up play, as players pick up when they cannot score and move on to the next hole.

It is a very popular format at club level in Australia and the UK, much less so in the USA.

RULES IN ACTION: 'Stroke and Distance' – What is it?
At any time during your round, you may take Stroke and Distance relief. This means adding one penalty stroke and playing your ball (or another ball) from where the previous stroke was made. So:

- 1. At BB: Your tee shot off the 2<sup>nd</sup> tee goes into the pond in front of the tee. One of your options (and probably the best option) is to replay your shot off the tee. This means you will now be playing your 3<sup>rd</sup> shot and as you are re-playing your shot, YES you can hit it off the tee.
- 2. You shank your 3<sup>rd</sup> shot into a green-side bunker and have a very bad lie in the bunker. 'One' option is to replay your shot ie from the original spot; with a penalty you will now be hitting 5.

**READY GOLF** was introduced with the specific goal of speeding up play, so making the game more attractive and enjoyable.

**Ready golf** means playing when you are **ready** and not waiting for the 'old-fashioned' farthest from the hole plays first.

**Ready golf** means **thinking ahead** so that you're ready to play. So, for example:

- when the player farthest away has a difficult shot and is assessing options
- playing your shot before helping to look for a lost ball
- shorter hitters playing whilst a longer hitter waits to play Where possible, advise your fellow players that you will play first. *And:* unless you will distract another player always try to proceed to your ball and get **ready** to play your shot.
- + The R&A advises a golf shot should not take longer than 40 seconds.

#### **GOLF ETIQUETTE: Silence is Golden**

Golf is as much a mental game and as it is a game of skills. Hence players should always show consideration for others by:

- not talking while a fellow player is taking their shot (or preparing to). This is especially important on the tee as players await their turn; and notably as groups may gather around the 1<sup>st</sup> tee waiting to tee-off
- making sure your mobile phone, or any electronic device, is not a distraction

Etiquette in golf is a set of guidelines aimed at ensuring the game is played fairly, safely and enjoyably for all. For more tips see the inside back cover of this booklet.

#### More on READY GOLF:

**Ready Golf** applies everywhere on the golf course so on the tees and greens as well as on the fairways. So:

On the Tee: The first to arrive at the tee should hit off straightaway if it is safe to do so. *And* then mark your scorecard whilst others are hitting off.

On the Green: Try to survey your putt whilst others are considering/making their putts. Then Ready Golf means putting continuously if the ball is not on someone else's line. And if you're waiting for others to arrive on the green go ahead and putt; especially with the 'Flag-in' rule.

#### **GOLF RULES MYTHS: Lost Ball**

There is sometimes a belief that you can 'declare your ball lost' - but you cannot.

A 'Lost Ball' is defined as: a ball that is not found in three minutes after the player or their caddie (or the player's partner or partner's caddie) begins to search for it.

In the 'dim and distant' past you were able to declare that your ball was beyond salvation and say so, but now the lost ball definition continues with: A ball does not become **lost** as a result of the player declaring it to be lost.

When your ball is lost you must take 'Stroke and Distance' relief - see Rule 18 (+ turn back to our May page).
